Our Kindness Campaign continued strong in July, with support provided to organizations making a difference throughout our footprint:

Cle Elum - HopeSource

Donations were delivered to HopeSource, a local organization whose mission is to equip, encourage, and empower individuals as they work toward stability and self-sufficiency—because hope changes everything. Items helped fulfill their needs list and support their continued efforts to uplift the community.

Bonners Ferry - Little Badgers Lunch Program
