## Kindness Campaign - Care and Compassion

February's Kindness Campaign focused on care and compassion, supporting crisis response and advocacy organizations across our communities. Donations were collected for Advocates Against Family Violence (Treasure Valley), Alternatives to Violence of the Palouse (Moscow), YWCA of Walla Walla, and Post Falls Police Victim Services. These efforts helped provide essential items for individuals and families receiving support during difficult circumstances.



## Ronald McDonald House Charities - CULAC Matching Donation

In February, we presented our third matching donation tied to 2025 CULAC contributions to Ronald McDonald House Charities of the Inland Northwest in Spokane. These presentations recognize the generosity of PIFCU staff and the important work organizations like Ronald McDonald House are doing to support families in our region.

More than 60% of families arriving at the Spokane campus had no idea they would need these services just 24 hours prior, with many arriving by helicopter or ambulance. Approximately 57% of families are caring for a premature infant or newborn with complications, 13% are receiving specialized oncology treatment, and 30% are there due to trauma or other serious illnesses.

Families are able to stay free of charge, with the average stay lasting 26 days, providing stability and support while their child receives care.



## YWCA SOUPport Our Shelters

SOUPport Our Shelters is the YWCA's largest annual fundraiser, and P1FCU was proud to support the event again this year as the delivery sponsor. Three teams of P1FCU volunteers helped deliver soup and hand-painted bowls to local businesses, supporting the YWCA's mission to serve individuals and families in our community.



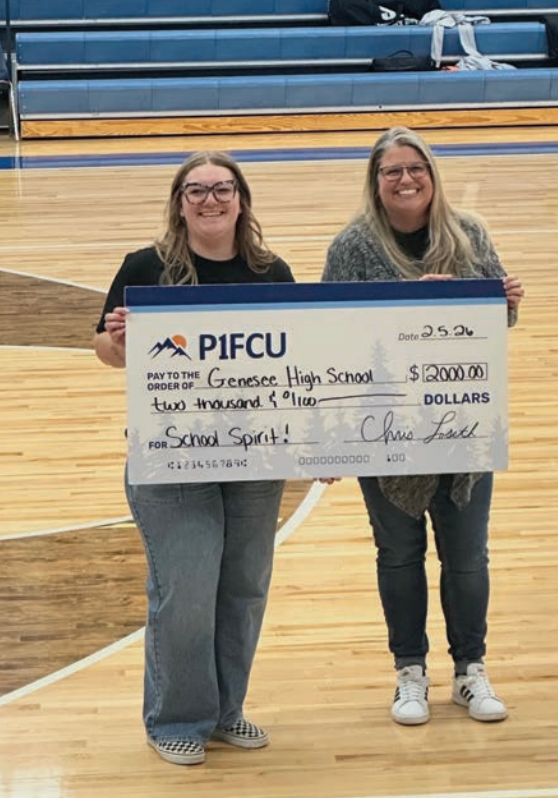
## Boys & Girls Clubs Grilled Cheese Program

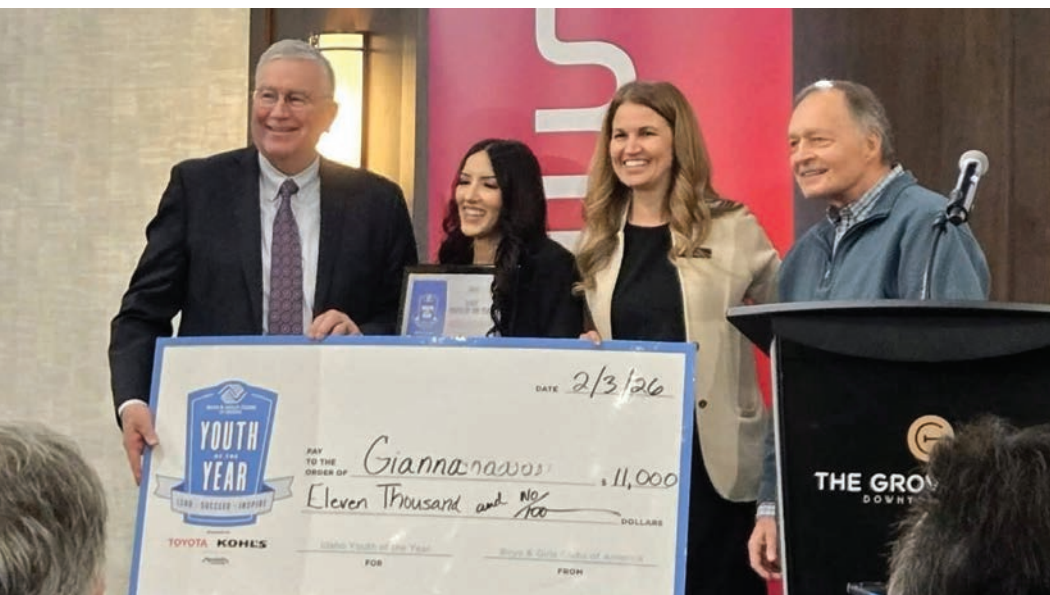


## P1FCU Cares - Camp Rainbow Gold

Camp Rainbow Gold was selected as our January P1FCU Cares employee giving recipient. The organization provides free, year-round programming for Idaho families impacted by pediatric cancer, offering youth, teen, sibling, and family camps designed to create meaningful experiences and support. Weeklong camps are held at Hidden Paradise in Fairfield, Idaho, the state's only medically designed, adaptive, and accessible camp, allowing even medically fragile children to safely participate. These programs provide children and families with an opportunity to connect, heal, and enjoy time together in a supportive environment.

## Idaho Foodbank – Family Day Volunteer Event

In February, team members and their families participated in P1FCU's quarterly Family Day volunteer event at The Idaho Foodbank. Volunteers assisted with warehouse operations, helping sort and prepare food for distribution to food pantries across North Central Idaho.
